

Faculty Position – Education Focus: Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH

The Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the University of Pittsburgh invites applications for a non-tenure stream faculty position in the education stream effective September 1, 2015. Although open to outstanding candidates in all disciplines of civil and environmental engineering, this position is intended for applicants with expertise in construction engineering and project management.

Preference will be given to appointees at the Assistant Professor level, but applicants with outstanding credentials will be considered at higher levels. The initial appointment will be for three years with the possibility of continuation and promotion according to the University of Pittsburgh Non-Tenure Stream Faculty guidelines. The University of Pittsburgh Swanson School of Engineering is committed to retention and promotion of faculty within the non-tenure stream, providing the potential for long-term career paths for individuals in these positions.

The successful applicant will be expected to develop and deliver courses at the undergraduate and graduate level in construction management, and eventually serve as the Coordinator for both undergraduate and graduate construction management programs within the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering (www.engineering.pitt.edu/civil). Capability to teach fundamental courses in civil and environmental engineering (e.g., fluid or solid mechanics, mechanics of materials, etc.) would be of interest. Interest and ability to participate in the research mission of the Department would be beneficial, but not required.

An earned doctorate in civil and environmental engineering or a closely related field is preferred, although candidates with an MS degree and extensive professional experience will be considered. Professional construction management experience and a professional engineering license or ability to become licensed would be beneficial. Teaching experience in a university or college is preferred.

Interested applicants should submit a cover letter, a detailed resume, a statement describing teaching interests, leadership efforts, and vision for new educational initiatives, and the names and contact information for at least three references, all in a single PDF file, to cee.nts.search2015@pitt.edu. Applications will be considered beginning January 15, 2015 and will continue until the position is filled.
