

Recommended Study Abroad Programs in Japan

Important Notes:

1. NORTHWESTERN Study Abroad Language Requirement: "At least one quarter of language instruction in an official language of the host country is required either before departure or while abroad." Most of the programs in Japan have their own language requirements above and beyond the Northwestern requirement. Check the list below for the requirement for each program.
2. NORTHWESTERN students must complete two applications: Northwestern University Application for Permission to Study Abroad and Application of a specific program. The students must abide by both NORTHWESTERN deadlines below and the specific program's deadline (listed in the chart).

 February 10: all other Fall and Fall-Winter, Full-Year programs, and all Summer programs
 September 10: all Winter-Spring programs
 November 10: Spring programs
